Objectives	 Development of creativity Encourage participants to explore and express their imagination by transforming written poetry into visually engaging video content. The activity stimulates innovative thinking and inspires artistic expression through multimedia storytelling. Creating a video based on a poem Guide participants in interpreting a chosen poem and translating its themes, emotions, and imagery into a cohesive and compelling video project using the InShot app. Creating digital content through literature Equip participants with the skills to merge literature and technology, allowing them to create high-quality digital content that highlights the power of poetry and storytelling in a modern, multimedia format. 	

Summary of the activity	In this activity, participants will create a personalized video using photographs they have taken, inspired by a poem of their choice. The goal is to visually interpret the poem's themes, emotions, and imagery through their own photography. Participants will use the InShot app to edit their videos, incorporating

Methodology and procedure

1. Choose a Poem

Encourage participants to select a poem that holds personal meaning for them, whether it resonates emotionally, reflects their experiences, or sparks their imagination.

enhance their storytelling. By the end of the activity, the finished video will serve as a vivid and artistic illustration of the chosen poem, blending literature and digital creativity into one engaging project.

2. Capture Photographs

Invite participants to take a reflective walk through their village, town, or natural surroundings, using their environment as inspiration. During the walk, they should capture photographs of:

- Images that directly relate to the words or phrases in the poem.
- Visuals that evoke the emotions or feelings the poem brings to them.
- Scenes or elements that symbolize the poem's deeper meaning or personal significance.

3. Create the Video in InShot

Guide participants to open the InShot app and begin crafting their video. They will:

- Combine their photographs into a cohesive visual narrative.
- Add sound, such as music or voiceover, to enhance the emotional impact.
- Use visual effects, transitions, and text to creatively illustrate the poem.
- Design a cover, add a title, and include final credits to give the video a polished finish.

4. Export and Share

Once the video is complete, participants will export it from the InShot app. Facilitate a sharing session where they can present their videos to other participants, fostering a sense

	of community and appreciation for diverse interpretations of poetry.
Resources/ materials/ setting needed	1. Smartphone A smartphone with a functional camera for capturing photographs and running the InShot app, ensuring participants can easily document their visual interpretation of the poem. 2. Poems/Books A selection of poems or books for participants to choose from, either provided during the activity or brought by participants themselves. These should include a variety of themes to inspire creativity and personal connection. 3. InShot App The InShot video editing app, pre-installed on participants' smartphones, to combine their photos with sound, visual effects, and text for creating a polished video project. 4. Optional Extras • Headphones for precise audio editing. • A notebook or digital notes app for jotting down ideas and planning the video. • A tripod or phone stand for steady photo capture, if available. Resources 1. Internet Connection A stable internet connection to download the InShot app, access digital copies of poems, and share the final videos with other participants or on social platforms. 2. Setting • Indoor Space: A comfortable room equipped with seating and a workspace for planning, discussing, and editing the videos. • Outdoor Space: Access to a village, town, or natural environment where participants can take photographs inspired by their chosen poem.
